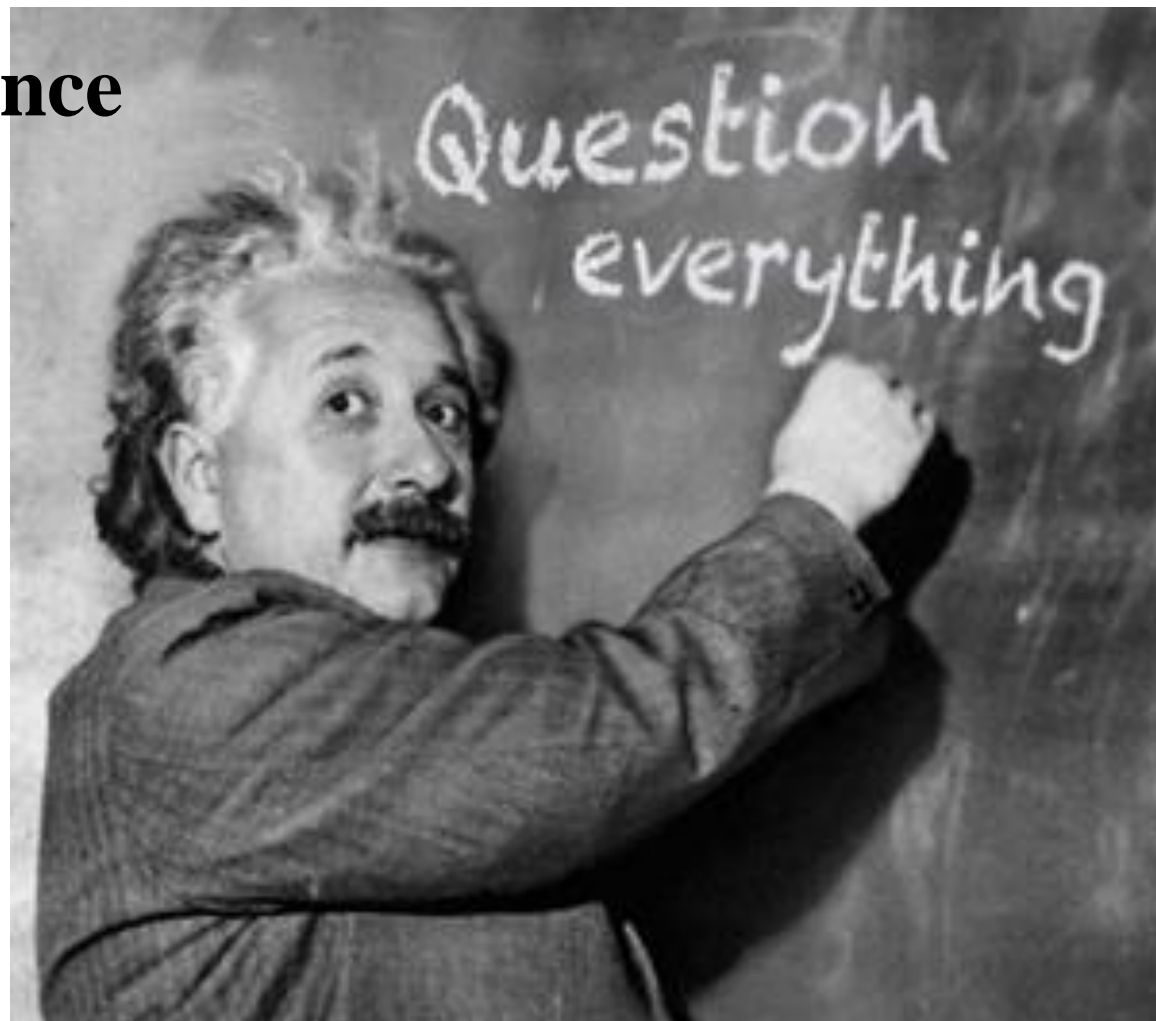

5 Phases Modell: Development of Environmental Movements

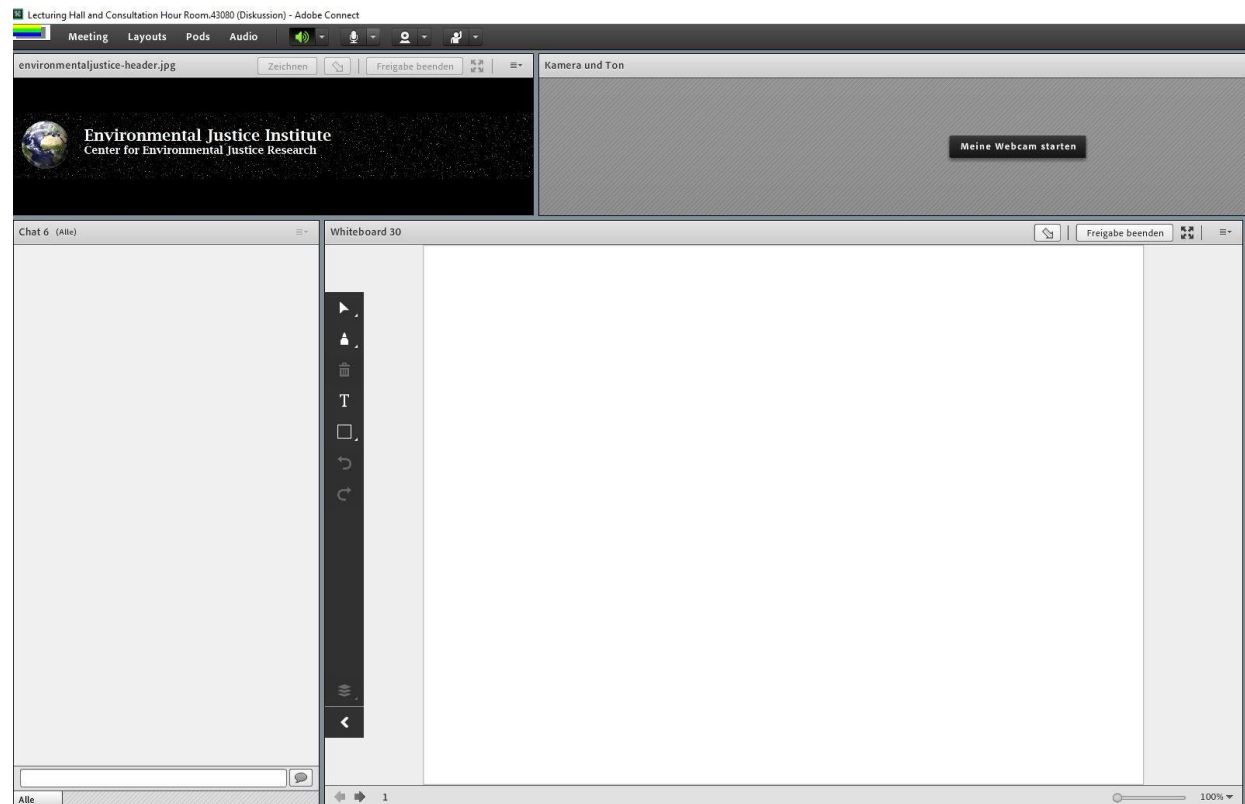
1. Emergence (1960-1972)
2. Boost (1973-1982/83)
3. Transition (1982/83-1990/92)
4. Assimilation (1990/92-2000)
5. Decay (since 2000)

Hypotheses

1. The ‘fair value’ (*Zeitwert*) of movements’ relevance decreases proportionally to its radicalism.
2. The clearer the goals of a movement, the longer the period of relevance or fair value for society.
